How to create a shortcut to open a URL with a specific Internet browser.


ENVIRONMENT

RESOLUTION

This process can be used to open a URL in Internet Explorer, Firefox, or Chrome regardless of the default browser.

- 1. Click Start
- 2. Click Programs
- 3. Click-and-drag [Browser Icon] to the desktop
- 4. Right-click the new shortcut and select **Properties**
- 5. On the **Shortcut** tab, click the **Target** field and move the cursor to the end of the text
- 6. Insert a single space and then type the URL



- 7. Click Apply
- 8. Click the **General** tab
- 9. In the **text** field at the top, give the shortcut an appropriate name
- 10. Click OK
